These people usually lived in conditions of terrible poverty.

MEN, WOMEN AND EVEN CHILDREN WERE EXPLOITED IN FACTORIES AND MINES; THEY LIVED IN SLUMS (OVERCROWDED AND POLLUTED URBAN AREAS WHERE PEOPLE LIVED IN HORRIBLE SANITARY CONDITIONS).
