Features of a NARRATIVE TEXT

(novels, short stories...)

- → AUTHOR
- → NARRATOR
- → STORY
- \rightarrow PLOT
- → POINT OF VIEW

AUTHOR and **NARRATOR**

Do you remember *Titanic*, the famous film by James Cameron? The story was written by James Cameron, but in the film the events are narrated by a girl: do you remember her name?

AUTHOR: the person who writes the story.

(the author of *Titanic* is James Cameron)

NARRATOR: the narrative voice an author chooses for particular reasons.

[...chosen by the author...]

(in *Titanic*, the narrator is Rose)

STORY and PLOT

What is the chronological sequence of events in *Titanic*?

Well, in a few words...

- 1) Jack wins the tickets
- 2) He falls in love with Rose
- 3) He saves Rose and dies
- 4) Rose is old and remembers him

IS THIS **THE ORDER** IN WHICH THESE EVENTS ARE NARRATED IN *TITANIC*?

STORY: the chronological sequence of events.

In *Titanic*:

- 1) Jack wins the tickets
- 2) He falls in love with Rose
- 3) He saves Rose and dies
- 4) Rose is old and remembers him

PLOT: how the events of the story are told by the author.

- In *Titanic*: **4 1 2 3**
- 4) Rose is old and remembers...
- 1) Jack wins the tickets
- 2) He falls in love with Rose
- 3) He saves Rose and dies

In *Titanic*, we look at the events of the film through Rose's eyes: do you think that Rose's fiancé (do you rememer that rich and arrogant man?) would narrate those events in the same way?

POINT OF VIEW: the angle (or angles) from which the story is told.
