

# LAY-OUT: HOW THE POEM LOOKS ON THE PAGE

#### STANZA:

A GROUP OF LINES GROUPED TOGETHER

## SOUND

#### RHYME:

# IT'S THE EXACT REPETITION OF THE FINAL SOUND AT THE END OF TWO OR MORE LINES

#### **ALLITERATION:**

IT'S THE REPETITION OF THE SAME CONSONANT SOUND AT THE BEGINNING OR IN THE MIDDLE OF TWO OR MORE NEARBY WORDS

### LANGUAGE

#### FIGURES OF SPEECH

#### **METAPHOR:**

IT'S AN IMPLICIT COMPARISON BETWEEN TWO DIFFERENT THINGS WHICH HAVE SOMETHING IN COMMON

("SHE'S AN ANGEL")

#### SIMILE:

IT'S AN EXPLICIT COMPARISON BETWEEN TWO DIFFERENT THINGS WHICH HAVE SOMETHING IN COMMON

("SHE'S LIKE AN ANGEL")
