Noun suffixes (2)



We can add suffixes to different words to make nouns:

- -ship often refers to a position that someone holds, e.g. friend – friendship.
- -ism often refers a theory or belief, e.g.
 Darwin Darwinism.
- -hood often refers to a state or time in someone's life, e.g. man – manhood.
 Notice that sometimes a suffix can cause a spelling change, e.g. feminine – feminism, race – racism.
